

Dear Potential SLPA Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the online AAS Degree, Speech-Language Pathology Assistant (SLPA) Program at Oklahoma City Community College. We offer a 62-credit hour program. The SLPA curriculum prepares graduates to work under the supervision of a licensed speech-language pathologist in school and healthcare settings. Courses provide instruction in screening methods for speech, language, and hearing disorders and in following written protocols designed to remediate individual communication delays or disorders. Supervised clinical experiences include working with clients of various ages and with various communication delays or disorders. Graduates who meet application for licensure requirements are eligible to apply for a Speech-Language Pathology Assistant License with the Oklahoma Board of Examiners for Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology (OBESPA) and an SLPA Teaching Certificate/Credential with the Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE). The enclosed information provides an overview of Program requirements.

Admission to the OCCC SLPA Program is a two-part process. You must apply to be admitted to the college (OCCC) and then apply for admission to the OCCC SLPA Program. Applicants are chosen on a preferential point system. When applying to the SLPA Program, you will need to speak with a Student Success advisor, who will provide information on the application process. Student Success advisors are located in the Office of Student Success Advising, located in the main building. That office requires no appointment; however, you may request one by calling 405-682-7535.

Students are admitted to the online SLPA program in the fall semester. Currently, 20 students are admitted each year. Students accepted into the program must attend a **mandatory** two-day orientation on the OCCC campus, July 21 &22, 2025. All SLPA academic courses are presented online except for clinic experiences. The SLPA Program is a two-year (five-semester) program with general education, support, and major (SLPA) coursework, along with an observation component of 25 hours. There are two Clinical Experience Courses (Fall 2 and Spring 2). Clinical Experience I and Clinical Experience II can be completed near your residence at facilities designated by OCCC. Clinical Experiences require a minimum of 8 hours of clinical fieldwork to be completed during a traditional work week for the fall and spring semesters of the second year in the program.

#### Admission Requirements

It is suggested that admission requirements be met in the following order:

- 1. OCCC Admission Application
- 2. Official documentation of high school graduation or GED completion if applicable
- 3. Official transcripts of ALL college work
- 4. Placement tests (Accuplacer Reading and Writing)
- 5. SLPA Program Application

The application process is completed online through the ONBASE software system. Please collect all documents necessary to complete the application prior to finalizing your application. Only complete applications will be accepted.

# Students entering the SLPA program are expected to display mastery of the English language with proficient oral communication skills. The student must be able to model appropriate speech and language behaviors correctly.

Due to clinical agency requirements, all students within the Health Professions programs must obtain an extensive, nationwide background report that includes, but is not limited to, Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) searches for sex offenders, violent offenders, and criminal histories.

Drug testing is required for all students in the Division of Health Professions. Each student will provide a sample for a 10 panel, pre-placement, random drug test prior to the first clinical assignment. Students must produce a negative drug result to remain eligible for the program. If a student is prescribed normal daily medications, from a medical professional, a Medical Review Officer will determine eligibility. Any student receiving a confirmed positive drug test from the MRO, one time, will not be eligible to continue in the program, at that time, but may reapply to any of the Division Programs for a future semester – based on program application procedures but readmission is not guaranteed. Failure of a second drug test will result in dismissal from any of the HP Programs with no opportunity for readmission. Any break in continuous enrollment will result in an additional pre-placement drug test, at the cost of the student. Licensing agencies require that any criminal history or positive drug test results must be reported to the appropriate licensing agency. Please note – while medical marijuana is legal in the State of Oklahoma, it is not accepted in healthcare or in any of the Health Professions Programs at OCCC. A positive test for marijuana will result in the student's loss of eligibility to remain in a HP Program.

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Information regarding the background reports, drug-testing requirements, and the procedures for accessing and submitting the required information will be forwarded to students selected for admission into the SLPA Program. Before selection for admission, if you desire more information regarding the required background reports/checks or the mandatory drug testing, please contact the Division of Health Professions at (405) 682-7507.

#### **Grade Progression Policy**

- A grade point of 2.5 and a minimum grade of "C" are required for all courses.
- All SLPA coursework must be taken in sequence; each semester's courses are prerequisites for the following term.
- Any student not earning a minimum of a "C" in any SLPA course must wait until the same course is offered again, retake, and pass the course before taking SLPA courses designated later in the course sequence.
- If a student is unsuccessful in a course (excluding Clinical Experiences I & II), the course may be retaken one (1) additional time to achieve success. If the SLPA class is not successfully completed upon the second attempt, the student will not be allowed to continue taking SLPA courses and will be dropped from the SLPA program.
- Any student who does not successfully complete Clinical Experiences I or II may repeat either Clinical Experience I or II *one time* for success. Note: You cannot fail both once and retake both once. If the second attempt is unsuccessful, the student will be dropped from the SLPA Program.

Applicants may complete non-SLPA major coursework (general education or support coursework) before acceptance into the SLPA program. However, this is not required.

#### Note:

Each applicant is responsible for:

- completing admission requirements
- confirming receipt of letters and documents in the admissions office
- keeping OCCC informed in writing of any personal information changes
- keeping copies of all documentation submitted to OCCC (i.e., CPR, etc.)

DRUG TESTING	Drug Testing is required for all students in the Division of Health Professions. Each student will receive a random pre-placement drug test before the first clinical assignment. Health Professions Division policy stipulates that if a student has a non-negative drug test one time, he/she may reapply to any of the Division programs.
